




Dear Sir: I am instructed by Dr. Calbreath to inform you that Thomas A.





Isend you by Deputy U. S. Marshall James W. Helms, two patients, both having been duly adjudged insane, as you will see by the commitments Mr. Helms will hand you. Their names are William Baur and Alexander H. Carpenter.
