My dear Governor Gruening:

Reference is made to my letter of March 27, 1952, in which I urged that the Territory make provision for the care of the mentally deficient. There are now at Morningside Hospital a relatively large number of children in that category, and for your information, I am enclosing a list of those aged sixteen and younger.

It appears to us to be of utmost importance that the Territory promptly assume responsibility for the care of these unfortunates. The Juvenile Code, we believe, provides the basis for such action and we hope that a suitable plan for care and treatment can soon beput into effect. Presumably an increased appropriation by the Legislature to the Department of Health or Department of Welfare would be required.

We have been stretching our authority under the Act of October 14, 1942, in accepting these children and in permitting them to remain at Morningside. The statute clearly authorizes care at Federal expense of persons who have been adjudged "insane" and who have been committed to a mental institution. It says nothing about persons, whether children or adults, who are mentally deficient. We have been accepting the children on a humanitarian basis when it appeared that there was no other place for them to go, but I have never been persuaded that it was genuinely humanitarian to care for them in an institution primarily devoted to the care of adult insane. These children are a responsibility of the Territory and should be recognized as such. If it appears necessary in order to overcome the evident inertia of the Territory that we refuse to accept mentally deficient children at Morningside in the future, or even that we take steps to discharge those presently in residence there, I am prepared to give serious consideration to such action. Before doing so, however, I should like to know what action the Territory is willing to take.
