The very sad news of the day is that Morningside Hospital is closing its doors today. Our census continued to lag about ten patients daily behind our needs, and the Board of Trustees decided on closure about two weeks ago.

We have, as you know, charts on all patients admitted from Alaska in the past sixty-odd years. Henry wonders if the staff at API would be at all interested in this wealth of material for research and/or teaching. If so, with your permission, he proposes we ship the charts to API via the cheapest possible carrier collect. This would be about four thousand patient records.

Let me know your decision and, if in the affirmative, your suggestions regarding carrier will be appreciated.
