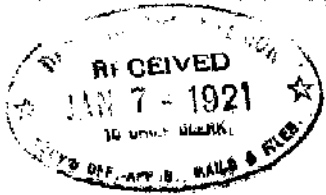

Sir:

Permit me to report that pursuant to your favor of October 19, 1920, the whiskey therein referred to has been turned over to me as Agent for the Interior Department, under an order of the United States District Court for the District of Oregon.

One hundred and eighty five gallons are now held by me in the Safe deposit vault of the Security Safe Deposit Company, and the balance of the delivery, the order for which called for a total of two hundred gallons, has been stored for immediate and early use for Morningside Hospital. Unless we shall otherwise advise this amount of one hundred and eighty five gallons will remain intact for three or four months while the amount released to the institution is in process of employment, as provided in your instructions.
