The letter referred to above was not received before I wrote you requesting leave to go to Salt Lake City to attend a meeting. That meeting will close on the 10th. I could come directly to Washington from Salt Lake City or return to Portland first and then proceed to Washington. It would probably be more convenient to do the former. If necessary I could give up the Salt Lake City meeting. I shall appreciate your advice and suggestions.

With reference to Dr. Schumacher's report I might state that the parttime physician mentioned there has since been discontinued. Also, the two women and three men mentioned in connection with the OT department as students are regular attendant employees assigned to that work. They change from time to time as a result of quitting or being assigned to other duties. Puget Sound College and USC have from time to time during the past few years sent one or two female OT students here for about a three month period for a sort of an internship. Usually their time had to be spent mainly in the berry, bean, pea, rhubarb, etc., patch or field with the patients. Some of them were not very satisfied with or happy about their experience. I forgot to mention, in the cannery. I might also mention that the clergymen do not get paid. I might also mention that recently another infant has been added.

It might be well to address any correspondence with reference to my Washington trip to my home address because the rural delivery at Morningside is usually a day or two later.
